In 1 Kings, we have the account of the Prophet Elijah standing at the entrance of a cave, waiting for the Lord to appear. As he waits, he encounters a strong, violent wind, a powerful earthquake, and a consuming fire, yet God was not revealing Himself in any of those powerful examples. Finally, as Elijah waited, he heard a soft, quiet whisper. At that, he knelt to the ground and prayed. God often speaks to us, not in grand and impressive ways, but in the silence. When we can still our hearts, that's when we begin to hear His voice, calling us into relationship and to follow Him. Sometimes that invitation is to follow the Lord as one who lovingly serves others in the priesthood. Use Your Talents!



Some people have many talents and can do lots of good things. Other people can only do a few things well. But no matter what you can do, new here? God wants you to do your best.





# From the Pastor's Pen

# **Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Hard to imagine that the Liturgical Year is coming to its close. The weekend gospel draws our attention to the end times. We hear the story of three servants who were entrusted with certain talents. Two of them were industrious. The one with five talents made another five; the one with two, another two. But the third one was afraid of losing in the game so he hid his talent way. He told his master "Master, I knew you were a demanding person…so out of fear I went off and buried your talent in the ground." The master trusted him while giving those talents but he did not. Thus, the one talent man stands center stage in the drama. The tragedy of the third servant in the parable is that, out of fear, he hid what had been entrusted to him, even though he had the ability to use it well.

Do you know that there are more one talent men and two talent men in the world than five talent men? The parable of the talents challenges us to do something positive, constructive and life-affirming with our talents here and now. We need to trust God enough to make use of the gifts and abilities we have been given. So, ask ourselves how are we using our particular gifts in the service of our Family, our Christian community and the wider society. Can I see the bigger picture, God's picture while making use of my talents?

Soon, Thanksgiving Day will be here. This year Thanksgiving celebrations will be different for many families. Take time to appreciate and be grateful to the good God who has given us talents and life. We will be having Mass for Thanksgiving on Thursday morning November 26<sup>th</sup> at 8:30 am at St Joseph Ridge. Before Thanksgiving Day, I will be in retreat from 22 to 25. I will definitely keep all of you in my prayer.

Just this past week, the priests received a letter from Bishop Callahan giving permission to start masses on Christmas Eve as early as 2:00pm. This does give us some unique possibilities and in the very near future we will publish the schedule for Christmas. Please stay tuned.

# **Parish News**

<u>Diocesan Annual Appeal</u>: Our parish goal this year is \$10,815 to help support the Diocese and all its good works. There are extra cards and envelopes available in the back of church. Thank you for your generosity.

<u>Book of Remembrance</u>: Throughout the month of November we invite parishioners to record the names of loved ones who have passed in our Book of Remembrance. Everyone is invited to pray for them. The Book of Remembrance is located in the back of the church.

<u>Plenary Indulgences for the Deceased through month of November</u>: According to an October 23 decree from the Holy See, "This year, in the current circumstances due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Plenary Indulgences for the deceased faithful will be extended throughout the entire month of November, with adaptation of works and conditions to guarantee the safety of the faithful." In brief, the changes include:

"a.- the Plenary Indulgence for those who visit a cemetery and pray for the deceased, even if only mentally [i.e., mental prayer], normally established only on the individual days from 1 to November 8, may be transferred to other days of the same month, until its end. These days, freely chosen by the individual believers, may also be separate from each other; "b.- the Plenary Indulgence of November 2, established on the occasion of the Commemoration of all the deceased faithful for those who piously visit a church or oratory and recite the 'Our Father' and the 'Creed' there, may be transferred not only to the Sunday before or after or on the day of the Solemnity of All Saints, but also to another day of the month of November, freely chosen by the individual faithful."
