# From the Pastor's Pen Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

"While they went off to buy it, the bridegroom came and those who were ready went into the wedding feast with him".

According to marriage customs of Jesus' day, a bride was first "betrothed" to her husband but continued for a time to live with her family. Then, at the appointed hour, some months later, the groom would come to claim her, leading her family and bridal party to the wedding feast that would celebrate and inaugurate their new life together. This is the background to the parable of the last judgment we hear in today's Gospel.

The parable of the maidens at the wedding was dear to the early church. Though delayed they were waiting in their expectation of the seconding coming of Jesus in the flesh. In the parable we hear the midnight cry, at an unexpected hour and the individuality of response. "Perhaps there will not be enough for us and for you" is a sentence that seems rather worse than unchristian: it seems heartless in its selfishness. But the focus of the parable is the wisdom of readiness.

Being ready is part of being a Christian. Do you recall what happens when a child is baptized? During baptism a candle is lit and given to the parents or Godparents as the priest or deacon says, "Parents and Godparents, this light is entrusted to you to be kept burning brightly.... May he (she) keep the flame of faith alive in his (her) heart. When the Lord comes, may he (she) go out to meet him with all the saints in the heavenly kingdom". Everyone is expected to keep the lamp burning brightly. We are to seek Him in love, meditating upon His kindness, calling upon His name, striving to be ever more worthy of Him, to be found without spot or blemish when He comes.

How does God speak to me? Have you ever wondered how God may be speaking to you? Perhaps you are waiting to hear a loud, booming voice come from the heavens to tell you what to do or which way to go. While this isn't completely out of the question, often God takes a much subtler approach. In 1 Kings, we have the account of the Prophet Elijah standing at the entrance of a cave, waiting for the Lord to appear. As he waits, he encounters a strong, violent wind, a powerful earthquake, and a consuming fire, yet God was not revealing Himself in any of those powerful examples. Finally, as Elijah waited, he heard a soft, quiet whisper. At that, he knelt to the ground and prayed. God often speaks to us, not in grand and impressive ways, but in the silence. When we can still our hearts, that's when we begin to hear His voice, calling us into relationship and to follow Him. Sometimes that invitation is to follow the Lord as one who lovingly serves others in the priesthood.
