If your family has an Advent wreath, today all four of the candles will be lit. This represents the light of Jesus coming


the light of the world. If we want to make Christmas beautiful, then we should make our own lives shine with the love of Jesus.







Our Advent journey reaches a climax with Mary's story and Mary's "Yes". It is also called Mary's fiat. In Latin, the word fiat means "let it be done." Mary's fiat was an immediate acceptance of and consent to God's will for her life. Therefore, Mary is presented as the perfect disciple. Those who find out what God wants of them and accept His message as Mary did are Jesus' true followers. Even without giving a chance to what it would bring about she said yes. In 1984 Mark Lowry was asked to pen some words for his local church choir, and he wrote a poem that began like this, "Mary, did you know that your baby boy would one day walk on water? Mary, did you know that your baby boy would save our sons and daughters?...." What a wonderful moment when Mary said yes to God. Christ took flesh in her consent and our Savior was born. As we celebrate Christmas, on behalf of St Joseph Ridge and St Peter Middle Ridge parishes and my own behalf, I wish you and your families a Merry Christmas. May the joy, the serenity, and the peace, which Christmas brings fill your heart, your home, and all who are dear to you. I would like to let you know that the 4pm Mass at St Joseph Ridge is at maximum capacity; signup is no longer available. So, if you have not signed up at St Joseph please plan for other mass. Who wants to turn away people on Christmas Eve when Mary and Joseph could find no room at the inn?
