"Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths."

This Sunday we celebrate the Second Sunday of the season of Advent. Each year on the Second Sunday of Advent our Gospel reading presents us with the familiar figure of John the Baptist. This year we read Mark's account of John's preaching. "John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins." To receive the messiah, John recommended a baptism of repentance in the river Jordan. A sign of conversion. To repent genuinely is one of the hardest things in the world: yet it is basic to all spiritual changes and progress. Genuine repentance must include the subtle sins of the spirit, often so elusive that they are unrecognized and so deceptive that they assume the shape of angels. As we move on to the second week of the Advent I invite you to reflect ways of personal renewal. Seventy-nine years ago tomorrow (December 7, 1941) we relive the memories of the sneak attack on Pearl Harbor that began a few moments after 8:00am. President Franklin Roosevelt called it, "...a date which will live infamy..." Over 2400 people (whose average age was 23) died that day in the attack. Thousands of others (both military and civilians) lost their lives in the resulting Second World War. I encourage you to keep all those who have died in war in your prayers. Remember especially, to keep the men and women, presently serving in the armed forces, in your prayers. Also pray for restoration of peace in war-torn places.

This week we also celebrate the feast of St. Nicholas and Immaculate Conception. This year Immaculate Conception is not a holy day of obligation. I do encourage you to attend the mass on that day. "The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and in view of the merits of Christ Jesus the Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin..." (Ineffabilis Deus - Latin for "Ineffable God"), apostolic constitution by Pope Pius IX. It defines the dogma of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Happy feast of St. Nicholas and Immaculate Conception!

Feasts of Mary: Tuesday, December 8 is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, Patroness of our country. We will celebrate the feast with Masses at 5:30pm at St Joseph and 8 PM at St Peter. On Saturday, December 12 is the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, patroness of the Americas and Respect Life. We will celebrate this feast with a special Mass on Saturday, December 12 at 8:30 am at St Joseph.

Advent Confession Opportunities: The Cathedral will not be holding their annual Advent open confession day this year. However, Fr. Biju will be offering Confessions here December 16th at St. Peter Parish from 6-9 PM with the assistance of another priest.

Church Decorating: This year things will be done a little differently. We hope to have family groups to take over the different areas (trees, garland, Nativity set, outdoor, etc) so as not to have everyone gathered at once. Watch for a sign up sheet to choose an assignment for YOUR family/group. We will decorate on December 19 & 20 unless other arrangements are made.

Christmas Masses: We are offering 3 Mass times for Christmas this year. They will be on Christmas Eve at 5:00 PM & 8:30 PM and Christmas Day at 10:30 PM. (Note the time change from the normal weekend mass times!) If you are able to be a Eucharistic Minister, usher or lector, please call or email Melissa. St. Joseph will have masses available at 4 PM and 7 PM on Christmas Eve and 8:30 AM on Christmas Day. PLEASE SIGN UP: Fr. Biju would like a general idea of how many people are planning to attend each Christmas mass. We will look into putting information on the website and Facebook pages but in the meantime there will be a sheet in the back of church.

Fundraiser for Casa Hogar: It has been decided that due to Covid we will not have our annual Christmas cookie sale to raise funds for the orphanage in Peru. We would still like to send them a donation from our parish. If you would like to contribute watch for a basket in the back of church to drop donations through December or place yours in a marked envelope in the collection basket.
