BEHOLD THE LAMB OF GOD

Our Christmas celebration and the Christmas season are over, and we began the ordinary time in Liturgy. This Sunday we hear St. John saying "Behold, the Lamb of God Who takes away the sin of the world". John's vocation was to show the world the "Lamb of God". The two disciples of John heard what he said and followed Jesus. To their question "where are you staying?" Jesus tells them, "Come, and you will see." "Come and see..." it's a "vocation" –a call from God. This is a call to know Him more. This is the call which he has addressed to every one of us. Come and see, also know Him. It calls for a personal experience of Jesus as our Lord and Savior. How do we find it in our daily lives is a question for every follower of Christ? Go back to the bible where we will find Him. On January 24th we celebrate the feast of St. Francis de Sales known as "The Gentleman Saint." He was born in Thorens of the Savoy region of France on August 21, 1567.
