





From the Pastor's Pen

"Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men."

Today we begin a continuous reading of Mark's Gospel that will carry us through this segment of the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This weekend we reflect on how Jesus invites Simon, Andrew, James and John and tells them "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." They "abandoned their nets and followed Him" God does call us to build the kingdom in ways we will never know. Even Jonah became His messenger. Our first reading is from the book of Jonah. The book of Jonah is a fascinating tale of God, stubborn Jonah, surprising Nineveh, and the famous fish. The book is a profound reflection about God and about all of us. This week's passage takes place shortly after Jonah's time in the fish's belly. Jonah finally performs the task that God asked of him, to call the people of Nineveh to repentance. People did respond to the call of conversion. "When God saw by their actions how they turned from their evil way, he repented of the evil that he had threatened to do to them; he did not carry it out". Like the parable of the prodigal son the story of Nineveh reminds us of God's love and mercy which is extended to anyone who repent.

This Wednesday I had the opportunity to get vaccinated for Covid 19. But on Friday I received the sad news about the death of one of my companion priests. He was tested positive for Covid 19. Fr Alwyn Zothanzanga MSFS (38) passed away on 1/22/21. He has been working in Swaziland, Southern African Region. He just completed five years of his priestly ministry on 15th of January 2021. I request you to pray for Fr Alwyn. **Eternal rest, grant unto him O Lord! & Let perpetual light shine upon him! MAY HE REST IN PEACE!**
