Our Lady and the Magi

On January 1st we celebrate the feast of Mary, the Mother of God. Do you know why Mary is so special? She always says yes to God. When God asked her to be the mother of His Son she said yes, even though she knew she would have to suffer a lot. She accepted Jesus' death on the cross because God willed it.

Mary was the way that God chose to come into the world. He could have come as a grown-up king with great power, but He chose instead to come into the world the way everyone else does, being born of a mother. From the Pastor's Pen

Wish you happy Feast of the Epiphany. Several moments in Christ's early life and ministry have been celebrated as "epiphanies," or "manifestation" including his birth in Bethlehem, the visit of the Magi, his baptism by John, and his first miracle at Cana. Today, we celebrate the visit of the Magi. The visit of the Magi occurs just before the Holy Family's flight into Egypt. We hear about the visit of the Magi only in Matthew's Gospel.

We know little about the Magi. They come from the East and journey to Bethlehem, following an astrological sign. In Matthew's Gospel, they represent the Gentiles' search for a savior. They also represent our search for Jesus. They had gifts for the new born king. The gifts of the Magi-gold, frankincense, and myrrh-have come to be understood as symbols of Christ's royalty, divinity, and eventual suffering and death. The visitation of the Magi reveals that in Jesus, salvation is open to all. Epiphany is about inclusion. Be blessed to know that I have a place in Him. On this day let's also reflect am I grateful to the Lord who came to save me? Do we still seek him? What gifts do we take to our Lord?

Next weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and the completion of the Christmas season. We then return to Ordinary Time in the Church's calendar on January 11 until the Season of Lent arrives with Ash Wednesday on February 17. I wish you Happy New Year and happy Feast of the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God.
