Lenten regulations are as follows: 1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday. 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.





Fourth Sunday of Lent

This weekend we celebrate the fourth Sunday of Lent. The Fourth Sunday of Lent is called Laetare Sunday. Laetare in Latin means rejoice. Holy Week and the Easter season are quickly approaching. We are half-way through the season of Lent. Like Gaudete Sunday, Laetare Sunday provides a similar break about midway through a season which is otherwise of a penitential character. Rejoice because He won life for us through His death. Before His passion and death while being with Nicodemus he tells "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." Healing came to the snake-bitten Israelites by looking at the bronze serpent hanging on a pole, so life is given to those who look up with the eyes of faith upon the Son of man hanging on the cross. It's also a time to reflect about how much God loved us on the wood of the cross. Rejoice because the Lord continues to call us, and to draw us close to himself.
