

Lenten regulations are as follows: 1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday. 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.



From the Pastor's Pen

Fifth Sunday of Lent: John 12: 20-33

"The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified."

A year ago, most churches throughout the world had closed their doors to public worship in an unprecedented move to help stop the spread of the COVID virus. We had virtual Easter celebrations. Never would I have imagined to have Holy Week without people in the pews. I hope and pray this year nothing will prevent us from gathering as one family to celebrate Easter in person. This weekend we celebrate the fifth week of Lent. As we approach the Holy Week, the readings give us the opportunities to reflect about the last days of the Lord. This weekend, we find Jesus announcing that His "hour" has come. Chapter 12 of John's Gospel is a preparation for the beginning of the passion narrative to follow. Jesus has just raised Lazarus from the dead—an important sign in John's Gospel, which inspired many people to believe in Jesus. This event also marks the turning point in Jesus' conflict with the Jewish authorities. John's Gospel tells us that the Sanhedrin met after this event and made plans to kill Jesus.

Following his triumphant entry into Jerusalem, Jesus says "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." At the wedding in Cana Jesus said his hour had not yet come but in today's Gospel he says the "hour" has come. The hour of glory for Jesus is his passion and death, because when he is lifted up from the earth he will draw all men to himself (John 12:32). Using the metaphor of the grain of wheat, Jesus presented the idea that his dying would be beneficial. He says "unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit."

As we continue our journey through Lent and draw near Holy Week, let us ponder on Jesus, the grain of wheat that fell on the ground and died but yielded a rich harvest. As we die to ourselves during Lent through our penance, may we produce a rich harvest.
