From the Pastor's Pen

"I am the good shepherd"

The fourth Sunday of Easter is called Good Shepherd Sunday. The image of Christ as our Good Shepherd has always appealed to human nature. This weekend we hear, "Jesus said, I am the Good Shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. A hired man, who is not a shepherd and whose sheep are not his own, sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf catches and scatters them". The concern of a good shepherd for his sheep is part of the shepherd's job. The actions of the good shepherd to protect and save are based upon the relationship and love that develops between the shepherd and the sheep. The good shepherd knows the sheep and therefore acts out of love. He also says "I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice, and there will be one flock, one shepherd".

The sermon preached by our Savior nearly two thousand years ago is still echoing and re-echoing around the world, calling on his faithful flock to do all in their power to help those other children of God who are still outside the fold. Do not shut your ears to this call of Christ today. Give him a helping hand by helping your fellowman to see the light of the true faith.

Sunday of the weekend has been designated 'World Day of Prayer for Vocations'. I invite you to pray for those called by the Lord to serve as religious women & men, those called to priesthood or to the permanent diaconate. Also pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life.
