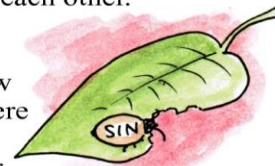
Kid's Korner

the kingdom of HEAVEN



In today's Gospel reading Jesus tells us about the Kingdom of Heaven. Heaven isn't just where we will go when we die if we were good. Jesus was telling us that Heaven grows in our hearts when we choose to love God and each other.

Our Lord compares the Kingdom of Heaven to plants that grow up from little seeds. When we were baptized we received the gift of Faith. When we receive the other sacraments, especially Holy Communion, the Faith grows in us, like a plant that has water and sunshine. If we sin it's like little bugs or sickness that start to kill the plant. Confession will take those away so that our Faith can grow again.



How can you help the Kingdom of Heaven to grow in you? Going to Mass and receiving Holy Communion whenever you can, and going to Confession often are the best ways. Praying every day and learning about the Faith and about the saints will also help the Kingdom of Heaven to grow in your heart like a strong, healthy plant!

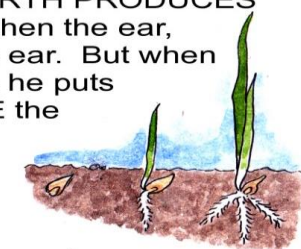


Answer to puzzle on front page: LIKE A MUSTARD SEED... THE GREATEST OF SHRUBS. GROW IN OUR HEARTS.

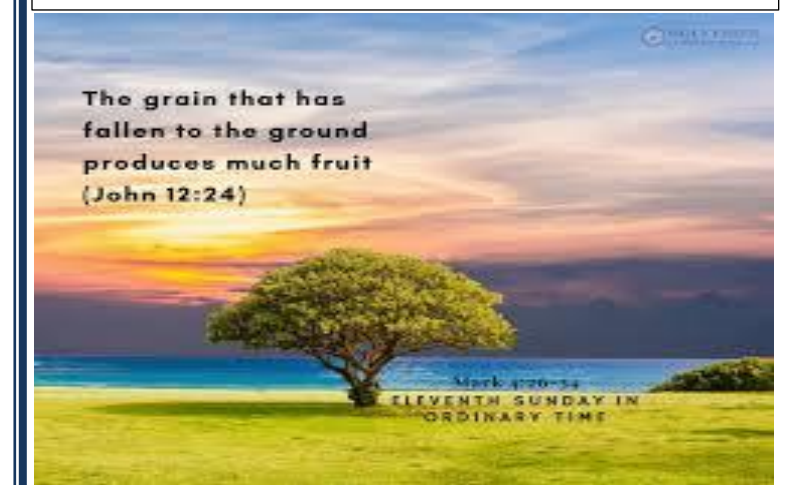

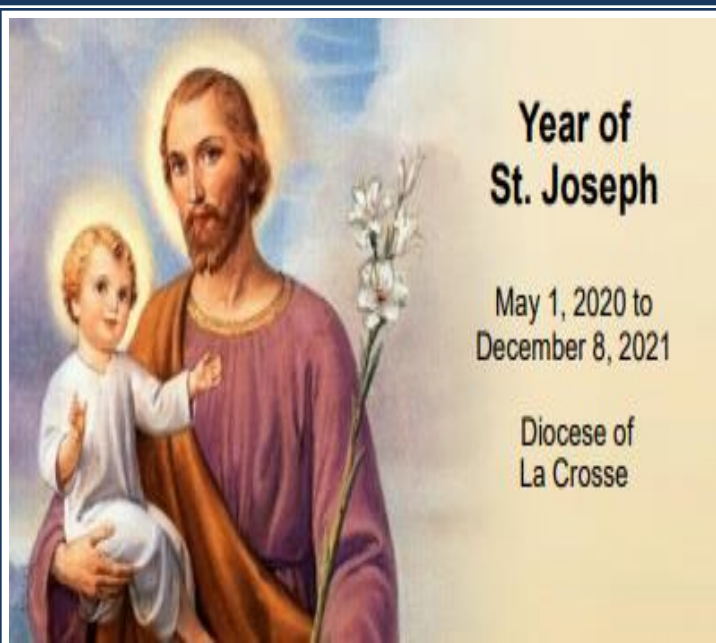

From the Pastor's Pen

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

After Lent, the Easter season, and three Sundays of feast days—Pentecost, Most Holy Trinity, and Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ—the Church returns to Ordinary Time. This Sunday's Gospel from Mark carries a significant message regarding faith and the Kingdom of God. Today's Gospel reading consists of two parables about seeds. In the first, Jesus tells about a man who scatters seed which over time sprouts and develops. Then when the grain is ripe, the man harvests his crop. The second parable focuses on the tiny mustard seed which develops into a tree. Though small at its planting, it germinates and sprouts and grows into a big tree with branches for shelter for birds of the air. In these images the potential fruit is not evident in the seed's appearance, but comes about according to God's plan and in a way that is mysterious to us. After planting hundreds of acres, the farmer can only wait. He cannot make the seed grow. It's not until the rows begin to appear that he knows the promise of a crop. It's the same with our faith as with its germination and maturing. God's grace without humble efforts will bring our life of faith to fruition. A favorite motto of St. Teresa of Calcutta was, "do small things with great love." This is how it works in the kingdom of God. God can do tremendous things if our heart is open to Him.

We are almost close to the financial year end and we still have not met the Diocesan Annual Appeal goal. We are almost there but not yet. Please remember that this Appeal supports the education of seminarians, support personnel for parish and school administration, and replaces 14 collections for national and global ministries formerly taken up in the course of each year. Please consider helping us meet our goal in the support of the wider church.

On June 14, 2021 each household in the diocese will receive a letter from Bishop Callahan. The letter will announce that the dispensation of the Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation in the Diocese of La Crosse will be lifted beginning with the weekend of June 26-27, 2021.
