From the Pastor's Pen

"Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?"

The episode in today's Gospel is about Jesus rebuking the wind and quieting the sea. Jesus was in the stern, asleep, waves were breaking over the boat. The disciples wake Jesus up, they ask "Do you not care that we are perishing?" Do you not care? These are people whose lives have already been radically changed, by their encounter with Christ. They have left everything to follow him; they have witnessed miracles and healings and have experienced first-hand Jesus' love, and yet they still doubt his care. What do you feel? Jesus asks them "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" With God life never dies. The God who calmed the seas for the disciples will calm the storms in our life too. Remember, even in the midst of waves and wind, God never stops caring.

Later this week the priests of our diocese will be gathering in La Crosse for Priest Unity Days. On Thursday, June 24, Bishop Callahan will celebrate the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral. The Chrism Mass is usually celebrated during Holy Week, but has been delayed until now because of gathering restrictions due to the pandemic. Priest Unity Days will conclude on Saturday, June 26, with the ordination of three new priests: Timothy Reither from St. Charles Parish Chippewa Falls, Eric Mashak from Cooks Valley, and Arturo Vigueras from Stevens Point. Unfortunately, attendance at both the Chrism Mass and the ordination Mass is restricted this year, but both can be viewed on the diocese's YouTube channel.

A happy and blessed Father's Day to all fathers, grandfathers, Godfathers, foster fathers and step-fathers. We ask God's blessing upon you. Pray that God may keep you healthy. Pray that you be blessed with the Spirit of love that they may grow in holiness and draw their family ever closer to you.

Server Training: Fr. Biju will have a brief refresher course for servers after the Sunday June 20th mass. Please plan to attend so we can get the new schedule put together.

Serving Schedule: We will be creating a schedule for mass helpers again soon. Please let us know if you are willing to be put on the schedule as an usher, lector or mass server. Extraordinary Ministers will be requested "as needed". We've heard from a few but not many.

Church Roof Repairs: The outside roof repairs are complete but we are still waiting to hear from the insurance company on the interior damage coverage. If you would like to donate towards the roof repairs you can place your donation in a marked envelope in the collection basket.

Mission Coop: Father Honoré Kombo from the Democratic Republic of Congo will speak at all the Masses in our Parish on the weekend of June 26-27, 2021 on behalf of his Diocese of Kikwit in the Congo as part of the Mission Co-op. The Diocese of Kikwit has recently celebrated its Centenary of Evangelization (2012-2017). Building on milestones of over 100 years of Evangelization, they take on the challenges to continue the work of the Mission today. Father Kombo will give the missionary appeal in support to the pastoral work of 194 Diocesan Priests, to help equip 5 most important diocesan hospitals with medicines and other basic health supplies, and to give children from very poor families an opportunity for education. A second collection will be taken up for that purpose. Thank you for your generous response to his appeal for the Church's Mission in the Congo!

Pray for our Farmers: The recent dry, hot weather has posed a serious threat to farmers in our region. Please remember them daily in your prayers, that they will have the moisture and other needed conditions for a successful growing season and harvest.
