

From the Pastor's Pen

John 6:1-15

"They all ate and were satisfied, and they picked up the fragments left over – twelve wicker baskets full".

Through most of Lectionary Cycle B, our Sunday Gospel readings are taken from the Gospel of Mark. Our Lectionary, however, leaves Mark's Gospel for John for the next several weeks. This week's scripture from St John chapter 6 begins a series of Eucharistic discourses. This chapter is sometimes called the "Bread of Life Discourse." In John's Gospel, Jesus' multiplication of the loaves and the fishes is presented as a sign of Jesus' authority, divinity and allusion to the Eucharist. John's description of this event also anticipates the Messianic banquet of heaven, as the crowd reclines and all hungers are satisfied with abundance. Jesus interprets the meaning and significance of this miracle as a sharing of his Body and Blood. He has left us a memorial of his eternal presence in the Eucharist which nourishes and sustains our soul and binds us together in him.

Every celebration of the Eucharist reminds us of the love of God and our gratitude towards his love. Just like Jesus transforms a young boy's offering of five barley loaves and two fish, in the offertory at Mass, we present the fruits of our labors, represented by bread and wine. These gifts, given to us first by God as grain and fruit, are returned to God in our offering of thanksgiving. God in turn transforms our gifts, making this bread and wine the very Body and Blood of Jesus.

Recently in the light of media news about Catholics and Eucharist the U.S. bishops meeting at their spring general assembly approved a plan to draft a text focusing on the meaning of the Eucharist in the life of the church. Exploring "The Eucharist, A Mystery to be Believed", "The Eucharist, A Mystery to be Celebrated" and "The Eucharist, A Mystery to be Lived" hopes it would help in our faith journey to realize that in the Eucharist we receive Christ himself.
