Happy Feast of the Baptism of the Lord!

On this second Sunday of the New Year 2022 we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. As we celebrate this feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we also come to the completion of the Christmas season. We return to Ordinary Time tomorrow, Monday, January 10. The next change of seasons in the Church will be the beginning of Lent on March 2nd, Ash Wednesday.

Jesus comes to John the Baptist to receive the baptism. He descended into the River Jordan to sanctify its waters and to give them the power to beget sons of God. Through the feast of the baptism, we are reminded of the tremendous gift of grace Jesus has brought to us all through our own baptism itself. At Christ's baptism the Holy Spirit descended upon Him; at our Baptism the holy spirit took its abode in our soul. At His baptism Christ was proclaimed the "Beloved Son" of the Father; at our Baptism we "become the adopted sons and daughters of God, brothers and sisters of Jesus, members of his Church, heirs of heaven and temples of the Holy Spirit. We become incorporated into the Church, the Body of Christ, and made sharers in the priesthood of Christ" [CCC # 1279]. By baptism we have become His beloved children and are commissioned to proclaim the Good News with our lives. Sins cannot cancel the identity we were given in our baptism but it is possible to forget who you are.

St. Peter's Church has been a place where many have received new life in God through Baptism. This year we have a baptism during the mass of Colt Henry Flock. Please keep him and his parents and siblings in your prayers. In the Rite of Baptism for Children it reminds the parents that they are the first teachers of their children in the ways of faith.
