

From the Pastor's Pen

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 6: 17, 20-26

I am back! Days went so fast. I had a wonderful vacation. Had good time with my family and friends. Thank you for all your prayers, wishes and gifts. I did pray for all of you. Some of you had given me mass intentions and I thought of you all at those masses as I celebrated them. First seven days I spent in home quarantine. Quality time with family. Then two weeks I was travelling and finally getting ready to come back. Last Sunday I had my covid test and Monday I got negative result. So, I am back again.

After a night of prayer in the hills Jesus had summoned his disciples and chosen an inner circle. Then he came down with them and stood on a level place. This is the context of today's gospel reading. This discourse of Jesus is often called the Sermon on the Plain. The beatitudes offer us a lifestyle to live, dispositions to be created, attitudes to be developed and invite us to share in the life of the kingdom of God, a life of blessedness. He instructs his disciples in the paradoxical blessedness of poverty, hunger, sorrow and persecution because they contradict our natural expectations in every way. Blessed are those who are poor, hungry, weeping, hated, excluded, insulted and denounced because in poverty, we recognize God's reign; in hunger, his providence; in sorrow, true happiness; and in persecution, true joy. Beatitudes help us to live in the reign of God.

This Sunday, the second Sunday in February is World Marriage Day and concludes National Marriage Week. The theme for this year's celebration of National Marriage Week is "Called to the Joy of Love". Pope St. John Paul II imparted his apostolic blessing to "World Marriage Day" in 1993. Pope Francis, in his Apostolic Exhortation Amoris Lætitia, states: "With inner joy and deep comfort, the Church looks to families who remain faithful to the teachings of the Gospel, encouraging them and thanking them for the testimony they offer. For they bear witness, in a credible way, to the beauty of marriage as indissoluble and perpetually faithful." (n. 89).
