Today's Gospel reading tells us about God's forgiveness. We are like the son who ran away and wasted all his money whenever we don't use our gifts or talents to serve God or others.



Laetare Sunday

This weekend we celebrate the fourth Sunday of Lent. The Fourth Sunday of Lent is called Laetare Sunday. Laetare in Latin means rejoice. Holy Week and the Easter season are quickly approaching. We are half-way through the season of Lent. Like Gaudete Sunday, Laetare Sunday provides a similar break about midway through a season which is otherwise of a penitential character.

Though we have many reasons to be concerned about our present realities this "Rejoice Sunday" reminds us to rejoice in the saving grace of God available to each of us in our daily life. The Good News that today's Gospel reminds us of is that God loves us and will run to embrace us with a loving hug; if we make the first steps, if we start on the path back to him. Recall the father did not send his older son out to look for the younger. He did not send his servants out to bring the young son back. He did not send an army to drag him back to the estate. But he patiently waited ready to run to his son as soon as he saw him on the horizon. The father is the centerpiece of the story of the prodigal son. Not the son who walks away from home but the father, whose love and mercy overshadowing the actions of his two sons. What it reminds us of is that God does not measure our life with our last mistake.

Lent is a special time to discover the mercy of God. I invite all to make this Lent fruitful by celebrating the sacrament of reconciliation. In the La Crosse deanery parishes, opportunities are there for confession along with the Guadalupe Shrine too. We have in both our churches confession coming up. Please check the bulletin for more information. Please make use of it to prepare ourselves to celebrate Easter well.

As we head into the fourth quarter of our fiscal year, please be attentive to our parishes' targets for the Diocesan Annual Appeal. If every household did its part, we would easily reach our targets.
