

From the Pastor's Pen

When Life Gets Too Busy

"Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her."

This weekend we have the story of Jesus in the home of Martha and Mary. These two sisters—as often is the case with siblings—are very different in how they receive Jesus. Martha is physically in the same house as Jesus. But when He speaks, instead of listening to Jesus, Martha is doing her own thing. Martha is in the presence of Jesus, but she is not present to Him. Does it happen to us?

In normal circumstances Mary would be expected, like Martha, to prepare hospitality for a guest. We find her at the feet of Jesus. Mary is in the presence of Jesus, and is also present to Jesus. Mary listened to Jesus' words: this is what Jesus calls "the better part". Martha is anxious and worried: not because she's doing something bad. Martha is anxious and worried because she did not take time to listen to Jesus. To profit from the word of God, we must let ourselves be moved by it in the depths of our heart. It is difficult to listen to the Word of God with our hearts when our hearts are filled with anxiety. The story of Martha and Mary shows the danger of losing sight of Christ in the midst of too much activity also giving time for Christ allows that better portion to propel you to action that will make a lasting difference in your lives and the lives of the people around you. May the Lord help us to choose "the better part".
