



From the Pastor's Pen

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In Chapter 12 of Luke's Gospel a man in the crowd shouts out to Jesus, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me." Jesus offers the man no help. Instead, he uses the question to teach what, in light of the coming judgment, life really consists of. Material and earthly things become outdated and expire; but spiritual things are eternal, they last forever. In this context Jesus gives us the parable of the rich fool. He was rich man in the worldly sense, who got abundant harvest. He was rich in material wealth and poor in spiritual life and hence a rich fool.

The reason for bountiful harvest is not given. Probably the weather and soil were good. The rich man and his workers might be experienced and experts. However, he forgot that the good weather, the good soil, the health and availability of laborers were the blessings of God. God favored him with plentiful harvest not just for himself but for all people who labored for it and the people living around him. This selfish man thought of "I" and "my" only. He became such a slave of his wealth that he ignored God and his neighbors. The rich man in the story represents the coward in us trying to make his life secure, who is not at all bothered about the other but only oneself. He filled his barns and built new ones. But Jesus tells "Take heed, and beware of all covetousness; for a man's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions. The only possession which we can take along with us is having a heart for God and others. That's the real treasure in the words of Jesus love of God and neighbor.

On August 4th we celebrate the feast of John Marie Vianney +1859. He is universally known as the "Curé of Ars": compassionate spiritual counselor who spent usually no less than eleven hours every day in the confessional in the winter, sixteen in the summer; patron of priests and the parish clergy.
