

From the Pastor's Pen

Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time - The Demands of Discipleship

Jesus is on the road, going from village to village to proclaim the coming of the Kingdom of God. Here he speaks of true discipleship Jesus explains that, when it comes to making a choice for the Kingdom of God, nothing can get in the way. When Jesus describes "hating" one's father and mother, he is not talking about feelings. Rather, he is emphasizing very strongly that choosing to be a disciple means that everything else—family, money, your own life—must come second. Jesus makes it very clear that being a disciple is not easy. It means to bear one's own cross. These difficult sayings of Jesus are followed by two brief parables (a person constructing a tower and a king marching into battle) that make an obvious point—don't start what you cannot finish. Discipleship is difficult and is something we can commit to only if we are prepared to put the Kingdom of God before everything else.

We have arrived at Labor Day weekend. It is appropriate that we ask God's blessing upon all our endeavors, manual or otherwise. He has blessed our country with many natural resources and our citizens with the inventive ingenuity to put them to good use. Labor Day weekend reminds us that it's the end of summer and the beginning of school for many. As they begin a new school year, prayers and blessings that they may be well prepared to be good and faithful citizens and just stewards of the blessings God has given.
