From the Pastor's Pen

The 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Gospel passage of this weekend is taken from the "Sermon on the Mount discourse". Selections from Matthew's Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7) will be the Gospel proclamations for the remaining Sundays up to Ash Wednesday. The sermon on the mount is Matthew's version of the moral and ethical behavior which Jesus expects and demands of all baptized followers of Jesus Christ. He says that He did not come to destroy the Torah but to bring it to perfection. The law was never intended to divide people into categories of good or bad, right or wrong, law abider or law breaker. It was to point the way to life. That's what Jesus does. That's why he could say that he came not to destroy but to fulfill the law. Jesus said to his disciples: "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill."

By this Jesus does not reveal new teaching. He simply offers deeper insights into the Law. In fact, the statement "if your virtue goes no deeper than that of the scribes and the Pharisees", means that we must not settle for the literal sense of the Law rather the spirit. The problem of the Pharisees and the Scribes is that their desire to keep everything in the Law easily led them to the desire to keep only that which is in the Law. He speaks about Law, anger, reconciliation, adultery, divorce, oath. In each of the examples that Jesus took to illustrate the fact that it is not enough not to break God's commandment, he demonstrates the full length of the application of the Law. Can I go beyond the literal meaning to the spirit of the law?

Today is World Marriage Day. The observances of National Marriage Week (Feb. 7-14) and World Marriage Day (Sunday, Feb. 12) are an opportunity to focus on building a culture of life and love that begins with marriage and the family. World Marriage Day is an annual observance to honor husband and wife as the foundation of the family, the basic unit of society. It salutes the beauty of their faithfulness, sacrifice and joy in daily married life. I pray for God's blessings upon you. Also, my thoughts and prayers are with those who struggle in their marriage and those who are separated/divorced.
