Oftentimes, our mind begins to wander at Mass because we only see bread and wine. What contributes to our distractions is the bombardment of noise and images on our mind that come through our physical senses (hearing, seeing). Therefore, we are much less attuned (aware) to the world of the spirit and the much deeper spiritual realities that are right here, all around us.

Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Jesus, help me to learn to be quiet and reveal to my heart the truth that this is really You present under the appearance of bread and wine.

This week, read about Jacob in the desert, who was very much afraid, and came to realize that God was present right there with him. As with Jacob, we can say as we pray before the Blessed Sacrament, "Surely the Lord is in this place, and I did not know it." (Genesis 28:10-17)

From the Pastor's Pen

"Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you"

It is very easy to love those who love us. It is natural and does not involve a superhuman effort because it is reciprocal. Loving our enemies has immeasurable value because it may ask much from us. In a community where there is so much diversity in personal characteristic, social strata, cultural backgrounds and various ways of doing the same thing, working together and forgiving when offense occurs can be a challenge. Sometimes in our working place or in the neighborhood we can meet individuals who have become our enemies. As Christians we are called not to maintain old resentments, to feed pride or to promote hatred for those who don't love us. We are called by Christ to be generous and to forgive.

Those who are called to the Kingdom of Heaven are to go beyond the way the world usually works. So, Jesus tells us "I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." Embrace the enemy. It is challenging. Jesus goes further and invites us "So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect". Forgiving our enemies makes us more like Jesus who on the cross praved for his executioners. Forgiveness is a healing balm. Can I forgive the other because Christ lives in me?

Next Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. Marked with the ashes of palms; a symbol that represents mortality and repentance, we begin Lent. It's a season of grace and renewal. A special season which helps us to ascent to the holy mountain of Easter. Prayer fasting, almsgiving, forgiveness, love of enemies, call to holiness are all part of the journey.

During this Lent there are Lenten booklets available at the back of the church. Please make use of it for your personal reflection. Stations of the Cross will be every Wednesday of Lent at 7 pm at St Joseph and 7:30 pm at St Peter Church.

LENTEN REGULATIONS: The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. Lenten regulations are as follows: Friday.

2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Cabin Feverfest: Our annual Euchre party, Cabin Feverfest, will be held Sunday February 26th. There are fliers in the back of church that can be taken around to local places. There is also a sign up sheet for items needed. There is a need for a few helpers too.
