What Happens in Lent?

In today's Gospel story, Jesus goes out into the desert to fast and pray for forty days. In the forty days of Lent, the Church asks us to fast, give alms, and pray.



In Lent we don't eat meat on Fridays. Many people give up things like candy or dessert for all of Lent. When we give up food that we like, it reminds us that food isn't the only thing we need- we need God too!



Giving alms means giving money or things to the poor or the Church. God lets there be people who need our help so that we can become better by helping them!

The third thing that we should do in Lent is praying. You could say an extra prayer every day- maybe an "Our Father" or a "Hail Mary" when you wake up or before you go to bed. Another good idea is reading a bit from the Bible, because when we read the Bible we let God speak to us.

What are some little things you could do for Lent? Try to do things that will help you think a bit more about God every day.

From the Pastor's Pen

Happy Lent to all! In the middle of the past week, we celebrated Ash Wednesday to mark the beginning of the Lenten season. The Gospel reading for Ash Wednesday (Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18) reminded us of the three traditional pillars of Lenten observance. Prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Prayer purifies our intentions and relates all we do to God. Fasting detaches us from our comfort. Almsgiving reflects our brotherhood/sisterhood with the poor of Jesus' family and reminds us that our true wealth is not in things, but in the love of God.

Every year, the gospel for the First Sunday of Lent is the temptations of Jesus in the desert. It is an important reminder for us, as we begin this holy season, that Jesus was tempted just like us. His success resisting the temptations is a model that we are able to imitate in our lives. To resist the devil's temptations, Jesus was aware he was being tried. When we fall into temptation, it is usually because we're not paying attention. Be alert and attentive to what is going on within.

As we celebrate God's mercy lets acknowledge our sinfulness our unworthiness. Let's consciously take an inventory of our lives. Our goodness and weakness or limitations. List them out. Discern in them a call to draw nearer to God. Lent calls us not to deny our limitations and weaknesses or hide from them. Rather, Lent calls us to accept our limitations and weaknesses and learn how, with God's grace, to transform them for the good of others.

Let me now leave you with this prayer: Lord, you know how much I need you and depend on you. You know my weakness and my faults. I put all my confidence in your love and mercy in my daily actions. I hope to learn to trust more in your power, your promise, and your grace. Lord, I wish to start this season of Lent with a sincere desire to grow in love, loving you more, loving my family and friends more, especially reaching out to those who I am not so fond of. Therefore Lord, help me learn to change what needs to change in my life. Give me the grace to begin this Lent with great enthusiasm and love, practicing a Lenten program of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Help me live it with joy, knowing that I am living it in your presence to please you and to live in true fellowship with those around me. Amen.
