# Saint Joseph

#### From the Pastor's Pen

## **Fourth Sunday of Lent**

Today is the Fourth Sunday of Lent and traditionally called Laetare Sunday or Rejoice Sunday. We are half-way through the season of Lent. Holy Week and the Easter season are quickly approaching. In this weekend's Gospel passage from St. John, we hear the story of the man born blind who not only receives healing from his blindness but also forgiveness from Jesus. Imagine the world of people who are totally blind. His eyes opened as Jesus touched him. Jesus invited the person to the world of colors, shapes and patterns. The blind man spoke about Jesus to others. Can I recall the times God has done some marvels in my life?

Every year the Church honors St. Joseph on March 19 with the Solemnity of St. Joseph. Since Laetare Sunday falls on March 19 this year, the Solemnity of St. Joseph is celebrated on Monday, March 20. Joseph was not a man of many words: he was a man of action. In Matthew's Gospel, he is described as "a righteous man" (Matthew 1:19). His actions alone reveal everything else we know about him. He brings Mary and the Child she bears into his home when, in the sight of the world, he would be justified in divorcing her. He leads the expectant Mary into Bethlehem, and flees with her and her Child into Egypt. When it is safe, he returns with the two into Galilee. He does all of this, because God asks it of him. He never hesitates. Each time we read that the angel spoke to Joseph, the following sentence begins with the action St. Joseph took. "Joseph awoke," "Joseph rose," "He went." Each time he received a summons, his reaction was to follow the call immediately. Never once did he hesitate. St. Joseph was a loving, faithful spouse to the Blessed Mother and a loving, faithful foster father to Jesus Christ. St. Joseph was a brave man who worked hard and was a humble man of great virtue. St. Joseph is also a good saint to pray to during times of difficulty and trial. I wish you all happy feast of St. Joseph. Again, on Saturday, March 25<sup>th</sup> we have the solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord too.

We will have Sacrament of Reconciliation on Wednesday March 22<sup>nd</sup> at 6:30 pm at St Peters. St Josephs time will be on March 29<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm. Father John Parr will help us with confessions at both parishes. Thanks to Fr. Parr. Confessions at the Cathedral is on Monday April 3 from 9-6pm. Since I will be also helping with confessions on April 3<sup>rd</sup> at the Cathedral, we will have morning mass at St. Joseph on Monday April 3<sup>rd</sup> at 8:30 am.

Holy Week, Abortion, and the Wisconsin Supreme Court Race: The PBS Wisconsin headline on Feb. 22 got right to the point: "National debate over abortion turns to Wisconsin Supreme Court race." It was referring to the election that will take place on Tuesday, April 4. Media coverage of the two Supreme Court candidates and their philosophies is widespread, and abortion has been the constant focal point. As we inform ourselves, and then cast our vote on April 4 – Tuesday of Holy Week – let us cherish the fact that Jesus himself took on flesh as a tiny, developing child in the womb of Mary, so that one day, on the Cross of Calvary, he might rescue us from darkness and sin. Likewise, every preborn child is in the image of the Lord who created and redeemed us.
