Message for the week of March 26:

In today's Old Testament reading God promised His people that He would raise them from their graves. In the Gospel story Jesus raised His


friend Lazarus from the dead. At the end of time God will raise everyone from the dead.



From the Pastor's Pen

The Fifth Sunday of Lent

"Untie him and let him go." (John 11: 44)

Nearing the end of the season of Lent, the Church this Sunday is knocking at the door of Holy Week (which begins next Sunday, April 2, with Palm Sunday), seeking entrance to the events that together form the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. This is the annual reminder of God's love for His people!

Today in the Gospel we hear the story of Lazarus being raised from the dead. As the story begins, we are reminded of the friendship that exists between Jesus, Lazarus, Mary and Martha. At Lazarus' death, Jesus makes His way to Bethany to console Martha and Mary. Martha and Jesus have a conversation outside the village in which Martha professes Jesus to be the Resurrection and the Life. Jesus weeps as He nears the tomb of Lazarus. He orders the stone rolled back. Having been warned of the stench of death if the stone is removed from the entrance of the tomb Jesus insists to remove them. The stone is removed. He cries out to Lazarus who came forth from the tomb wrapped in his burial cloth. "Untie him," Jesus said, "and let him go." His bindings are removed and life begins again. Free to live, Lazarus walks this earth once again.

There is hope when Jesus intervenes. His grace and power will help us to walk in the light. Does our sin, suffering and death bind us? Wallowing in the pain and helplessness, one can feel bound as Lazarus. What deaths keep us bound? What cloths must we untie? Jesus invites us to a new way of living. There is still time... "Come out!" Death will not have the final word. Lent continues to invite us to a new way of living.

Have a blessed Lent.

Holy Week, Abortion, and the Wisconsin Supreme Court Race: The PBS Wisconsin headline on Feb. 22 got right to the point: "National debate over abortion turns to Wisconsin Supreme Court race." It was referring to the election that will take place on Tuesday, April 4. Media coverage of the two Supreme Court candidates and their philosophies is widespread, and abortion has been the constant focal point. As we inform ourselves, and then cast our vote on April 4 – Tuesday of Holy Week – let us cherish the fact that Jesus himself took on flesh as a tiny, developing child in the womb of Mary, so that one day, on the Cross of Calvary, he might rescue us from darkness and sin. Likewise, every preborn child is in the image of the Lord who created and redeemed us.
