Message for the week of April 16 – Divine Mercy:

The Eucharist is the Great Miracle of Mercv In His great love for us, Jesus gave us a great miracle of mercy: The Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. God did not only become man in the Incarnation to give His life for us on the cross and to rise again in glory for our salvation. The Incarnation also looked forward to Jesus remaining physically with us in the Eucharist as we journey through this life. The Divine Mercy Image of Jesus with the white and red rays represents our Eucharistic Lord, whose Heart has been pierced and now pours forth the water of Baptism and the Precious Blood of the Eucharist as a fountain of mercy for us. This week, as we continue the Easter Season and celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, let's pray right now 3 times the words that Jesus gave St. Faustina: "Jesus, I trust in You!" This week, read how Jesus appears to Thomas who was not present when He first appeared to the Apostles after His Resurrection. From the Pastor's Pen

Sunday of Divine Mercy

Happy Divine Mercy Sunday. "Jesus said to Sr. Faustina one day: 'Humanity will never find peace until it turns with trust to Divine Mercy' (Diary, p. 132). Divine Mercy! This is the Easter gift that the Church receives from the risen Christ and offers to humanity at the dawn of the third millennium." - St. Pope John Paul II, Divine Mercy Sunday Homily, April 22, 2001.

St. Faustina's Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy be observed. One of the instances is mentioned here: My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. ... Let no soul fear to draw near to Me. ... It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. *Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy*. (Diary, no. 699)

The Deanery of the La Crosse Diocese has chosen the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in La Crosse for the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday. Please check the website of the Shrine for more information.

Along with the Divine Mercy Sunday today we also celebrate the transforming power of resurrection. In the Gospel, risen Christ enters the room in which apostles are hiding. He blesses them with peace. The Apostle Thomas is not present on this occasion and refuses to believe the witness of the other disciples. He did not believe the words of his companions about the Lord's appearance. "Unless I see the mark...put my finger into the nail marks...my hand into his side, I will not believe." It would appear that even among the earliest Christians there was some disagreement about the need to see solid evidence before believing. No one should feel guilty or ashamed of doubt. Its ok to have doubts. It is part of being human. Like Thomas we often doubt what we cannot see and though yet Jesus does not reject Thomas because of his unbelief. He comes back for him. Jesus continually comes back to us. He never stops believing in us. A week later Thomas is present when the Risen Lord appears again. There, Thomas makes a profession of faith as he says, "My Lord and my God!"

Congratulations to all those CCD Students who were confirmed this week. May your faith be strong.
