Message for the week of May 21:

Receiving the Eucharist – Our Closest Union with Jesus on Earth

The Mass is a re-presentation of the Holy Sacrifice that Jesus made of Himself on the cross for our salvation. Because God is outside time and space, at Mass the same sacrifice that Jesus offered for our sins is made present. When we receive Holy Communion at Mass, we are receiving Jesus Himself, which is our closest union with Him on earth. Taking His Body and Blood into our own bodies, we are united with Him in a deep and intimate bond. Jesus feeds our souls, strengthening us to be faithful by loving and serving Him through serving others, most especially those in need. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Jesus please strengthen me to be committed to coming to Mass early so that I can spend some time quietly preparing to be united with You in Holy Communion. This week read the words of Jesus about remaining in Him and He in us in John 6:54-58.

From the Pastor's Pen

The Ascension of the Lord

The Feast of the Ascension commemorates Jesus' ascension into heaven 40 days after his resurrection. Thus, Ascension Day falls 40 days after Easter, on the 6th Thursday of Easter. In our diocese the solemnity is celebrated on the Sunday after the traditional date. The Ascension is an important Christian feast attesting and celebrating the reality of Jesus Christ's returning to the Father, to return again in the future parousia. The Ascension is the final component of the paschal mystery, which consists also of Jesus' Passion, Crucifixion, Death, Burial, Descent Among the Dead, and Resurrection. Along with the Resurrection, the Ascension functioned as a proof of Jesus' claim that he was the Messiah. Early Christian art and iconography portrayed the Ascension frequently, showing its importance to the early Church.

One cannot overstate what a major turning point, or transitional experience was Ascension in the lives of the earliest Christians. The Lord Jesus had been present among them and had engaged them very much like any other ordinary person. With the Ascension, the Lord now enters into a whole new way of connecting with them and relating to them. Matthew recalls being spoken by Jesus at the very end of his Gospel story: "I am with you always, to the end of the age." He is with us in a new way. Even though the manner of connecting to the Lord has changed, in no way is he any less present to his followers.

Before the ascension Jesus commissioned his apostles to take his message to the ends of the earth. He told them "be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Jesus tells us, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations." This mission continues through each of us. The baton is handed over to us. Remember his promise that "I am with you always, to the end of the age."
