Message for the week of June 11:

The Holy Eucharist is Jesus Christ, really and truly present. The Feast of Corpus Christi celebrates the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. At the consecration of every Mass, the priest prays the words which Jesus Himself pronounced over bread and wine, "This is My Body," "This is My Blood." The bread is no longer bread, and the wine is no longer wine. We receive Jesus Himself as nourishment for our souls. This week read these words of Jesus every day:

"Whoever eats My Flesh and drinks My Blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day". (John 6:54).

The Body and Blood of Christ

Today we celebrate the feast day of the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. At the Last Supper, Jesus knew that He was going to leave His friends. So He turned the bread into His Body and the wine into His Blood - even though they still looked like bread and wine - and told the Apostles to do the same.

Jesus gave the Apostles, who were the first priests, the power to change bread and wine into His Body and Blood in the Mass. Now at every Mass Jesus comes to us on the altar, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity!

Of course we can't see any change happen when the priest consecrates the bread and wine, but we know that God can do things without us understanding them. He loves us so much that He wants to come to us hidden in Holy Communion. Now it is up to us to love Him back with our whole hearts!



Corpus Christi

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

Jesus is the heavenly bread. He came down from heaven as spiritual bread to nourish our souls. Our souls cannot live without this lifegiving bread. The listeners of Jesus' time knew of the bread from heaven that was the manna that God provided daily from above. God told Moses: "I am going to rain down bread from heaven for you." (Exodus 16:4). "In the evening, quail came up and covered the camp. In the morning there was a layer of dew all about the camp." (Exodus 16:13). Jesus is the new bread and flesh that came down from heaven to sustain our spiritual life. He comes to us in the form of bread and wine in the Holy Eucharist.

The Second Vatican Ecumenical Council teaches that "the liturgy is the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed; at the same time, it is the font from which all her power flows." As we celebrate the solemnity of Corpus Christi, Jesus Christ invites us to return to the source and summit of our faith in the celebration of the Eucharist.
