

From the Pastor's Pen

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This weekend we conclude three weeks of readings from the 13th Chapter of Matthew's Gospel. Throughout these past couple of weeks, we had been listening to Jesus teaching crowds about the kingdom of heaven. This week Jesus offers three more short parables. In one of the parables Jesus compares the kingdom of God to a fine pearl of great value. Jesus says "the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant searching for fine pearls. When he finds a pearl of great price, he goes and sells all that he has and buys it." Fine pearl of great value. The merchant sells all that he has. Here we encounter an issue of priorities. The fact that what the dealer had to sell included presumably other, lesser, pearls might however have led the hearers to reflect on the value of the kingdom of heaven in relation to other competing ideologies; once you have it, you need no other.

If the Kingdom of God requires a lot of investment to obtain and is of great value, we need to ask ourselves where do I invest my time and energy each day? Do I work for God's kingdom or am I investing in building up my own? Have you ever considered tracking how you spend your time, talents and energy? You may be surprised! The demands of secular life and the agendas competing for our attention can quickly take us way from His kingdom. We can get tired and spiritually apathetic. But if we can see our way through all of the conflicting voices and hear the voice of God, we can rediscover our zeal and passion for God's kingdom or life with God.

From the first of August we have the 37th World Youth Day celebration with the theme "Mary arose and went with haste" (Lk 1:39). It's a global celebration of young people. This year it's going to be at Lisbon, Portugal from August 1-6, 2023. The US Conference of Catholic Bishops announced July 24 that more than 28,600 individuals, most between the ages of 18 and 25 will be there at the gathering. Pray that it will be a great success for the young people to discover the beauty of their faith and appreciate it.
