

From the Pastor's Pen

Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Last week we listened to the question of Peter how often must I forgive? To which Jesus answered "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times. This answer of Jesus points to the fact that God's ways and reason are different from ours. Today we have another instance in the parable of the landowner and the Workers in the Vineyard where the owner pays the same amount to all who came for work irrespective of hours each one put in. We may wonder how this can be possible? Secular wisdom would have a huge problem with this.

On the surface, the scene in the Gospel appears unfair, even unjust, as workers who come at the 11th hour are paid the same as those who work all day. From a purely human standpoint this scenario makes little sense. And that's when we realize something deeper is unfolding. God is generous in a way that far surpasses our best human standards of justice and fairness. This generosity of God is highlighted in the message conveyed by the prophet Isaiah: "my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord".

The paradox we encounter in Gospel parables is meant to open us up to a deeper understanding of who God is and who we are in relationship to God. It also shows us how God looks at us, sees our needs, and meets those needs. How much he wants us to be saved. He is exceptionally generous with us. On September 29th we celebrate the feast of the Archangels; Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. Prayers for all those who bear their names.
