Message for the week of September 3:

We respond with thanksgiving after receiving Jesus in Holy Communion. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, and the words of Jesus repeated by the priest, a miracle happens at every Mass. The substance of the bread and wine become the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus, even though the bread and wine still look the same. When we receive Jesus, we want to thank Him for this incredible Gift. Then we can speak with Him about anything that is on our heart. We also want to listen to what He might say to us in the quiet of our heart.

Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Jesus, I believe in you. Jesus, I hope in You. Jesus, I want to love You with all my heart Jesus, I thank You for having come to dwell in me as I receive You in Holy Communion. I welcome You into my heart and I ask you to "crowd out" whatever might be there that is not of You. And I desire to give You full reign as my Lord, my Savior and my King. Thank You for giving Your life for me on the Cross, loving me this much and allowing me to receive You into my heart in this present moment. And now that You are so close to me, please help me love You more and more, and serve You by loving the people around me. Amen.



From the Pastor's Pen

Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus teaches the disciples regarding the suffering messiah who will suffer die and rise again. Peter could not understand why Jesus must suffer and die. He tries to admonish him. He received reprimand from Jesus and also receives the correct teaching about the cross. Jesus tells his disciples that they have to deny themselves, carry the cross and follow him to be his followers. He tells them "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me" Being a disciple of Jesus has a price.

To be a Christian to be on the journey of discipleship is to have our life changed, to be led in unexpected ways sometimes it is in ways we would rather not go as our cross is heavy and painful. Sometimes we are called to carry the cross of being hurt by others. At times we look for life of false expectations, life of illusions that is free from all pain and sufferings.

If we can hold on, discipleship leads us to the life with God. It's the road that leads to the way, the truth and life. The promise of Jesus is there for all of us to seize hold of today and make our own. Jesus tells us "Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it".

September 4 is Labor Day. Since, 1894 the first Monday in September has been observed as a federal holiday to honor workers in the USA. Originally established to honor the nation's working people, this holiday has come to be seen as the end of the summer season. The Catholic Church has a long history of speaking out for the rights of workers. Papal encyclicals such as Pope Leo XII's *Rerum Novarum* helped establish rights and better treatment for workers everywhere. Pray for people who are engaged in various works contributing to the growth of the nation. I encourage you and your family to join for the 5:30 Mass on Monday, September 7th at St Joseph to ask God's blessing upon all our endeavors.
