## **Message for the week of October 15:**

"God is love." It's so important to remember that God is not just loving but He is LOVE itself. Our Heavenly Father reveals - shows us – that He is love and that He desires to share His love by creating us. He created each one of us out of love. Our Heavenly Father only wants to love us. We are able to recognize His love in that Our Father sent His only Son to give Himself to us in the Eucharist and to give His life for us on the Cross. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Heavenly Father, thank you for Your love for me. This week, read how St. John the Evangelist explains how we know that God is love: "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love. In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and his love is perfected in us" (1 John 4: 7-12).



## From the Pastor's Pen

## **Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Through the parable of the Royal Wedding Banquet, we hear the thrilling invitation of Jesus: Come to my feast! Put on your glorious attire! Enter into my joy! This is God's invitation to us to enter eternal life. And yet: this parable does not make us feel at all comfortable. For the weight of this story falls not so much on the invitation, as on the refusal of those invited.

In the journey of Christian Discipleship, responsiveness to God's call is paramount. Spiritual growth is anchored in our ability to recognize and honor these divine invitations, stepping into the fullness of life they promise. The essence of Christian discipleship lies in our daily choices. Each decision to embrace God's call propels us closer to spiritual growth and eternal fellowship with Him. Obstinately saying no through our indifference is a catastrophe for us. Is Jesus trying to intimidate or bully us into following him? No, because that is certainly not how he treats anyone in the Gospels. There is freedom. There is mercy in him. Remember how Peter who denied him gets reunited with Christ. Ultimately our choice for him matters.

The Eucharistic Miracles Exhibit will be at St Peter October 18-22. I hope everyone take advantage of the exhibit and grow in our faith in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. There will be a speaker here on the 18th to talk to the CCD students, parents and parishioners on the related topic at 7:00 pm.
