Advent: A Time of Preparation: This year, the season of Advent begins on Sunday, December 3rd. Advent is the four weeks we set aside for preparing our hearts before the annual celebrations of Christ's birth on Christmas. The Incarnation – God becoming man – is the turning point of history. Our Heavenly Father loves us so much that He promised to send us a Savior after the Original Sin of Adam and Eve. And He kept His promise. The Son of God was born in Bethlehem to give His life for us on the cross so that our sins can be forgiven, so that we "may have life, and have it to the full." (John 10:10). This preparation during Advent is to include interior penance, which involves a conversion of heart toward God and away from sin. Let us take Advent seriously by taking more time for prayer, offering small sacrifices for peace in families and the world, and receiving the Sacrament of Penance.

From the Pastor's Pen **Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Hard to imagine that the Liturgical Year is coming to its close. The weekend gospel draws our attention to the end times. We hear the story of three servants who were entrusted with certain talents. Two of them were industrious. The one with five talents made another five; the one with two, another two. But the third one was afraid of losing in the game so he hid his talent way. The tragedy of the third servant in the parable is that, out of fear, he hid what had been entrusted to him, even though he had the ability to use it well. How often we are paralyzed by fear or false prudence into doing nothing, into trying to preserve ourselves! Sometimes, we don't take God's gifts seriously or think we have been given very little, and we use that as a rationalization for making no effort or producing little for God. We blame circumstances or others, but the fact is we are neglecting to produce the fruits God wants. The master didn't expect a return of five talents from the servant to whom he gave only one. He would have been happy with a return of one more, but the lazy servant closed in on his egoism, self-love, and laziness. Are we making the best use of all God has given us, or have we neglected some things and taken others for granted? So, ask ourselves how are we using our particular gifts in the service of our Family, our Christian community and the wider society? Can I see the bigger picture, God's picture while making use of my talents?

Soon, Thanksgiving Day will be here. There are a lot of things in life for which we need to be grateful. I am thankful for the mess to clean up after a party because it means I am blessed with family and friends. I am thankful for the clothes that fit a little too snugly because it means I have had enough to eat. I am thankful for a lawn that needs mowing, windows that need cleaning, gutters that need fixing because it means I have a home. I am thankful for all the complaining I do about the government because it means we have freedom of speech. I am thankful for the one behind me in Church who sings off-key because it means I can hear. I am thankful for weariness and aching muscles at the end of the day because it means I have been productive. I am thankful for the alarm that goes off early in the morning because it means I am alive. I am thankful for the talents given whether five, two or one. Next weekend we will baptize two new members of the parish; Declan Otto Geier, son of Brandon & Amelia and Sylvia Noelle Slattery, daughter of Robert & Nicole. Please keep them all in your prayers.
