Message for the week of December 10:

A Minute with Jesus during the National Eucharistic Revival. Does Jesus understand everything about me? Jesus knows exactly what you are feeling and understands. Where you are, Jesus has been; He shares every joy and every pain with you. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: If you have something painful in your heart, speak with Jesus about it and give it to Him. This week, read from Scripture how the angel appears to Joseph and guides him to take his wife Mary into his home in Matthew 1: 18-25. Note: Mary and Joseph were married in the Jewish tradition, which is referred to as being betrothed. There are two parts to betrothal: marriage and, after one year, sharing a common home.

Celebrate Our Lady: Nearly 500 years ago, Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared to Saint Juan Diego in Mexico. The Solemnity of Our Lady of Guadalupe is December 12th. Advent: A Time of Preparation: Advent is the four weeks we set aside for preparing our hearts before the annual celebrations of Christ's birth on Christmas. The Incarnation – God becoming man – is the turning point of history. Our Heavenly Father loves us so much that He promised to send us a Savior after the Original Sin of Adam and Eve. And He kept His promise. The Son of God was born in Bethlehem to give His life for us on the cross so that our sins can be forgiven, so that we "may have life, and have it to the full." (John 10:10). This preparation during Advent is to include interior penance, which involves a conversion of heart toward God and away from sin. Let us take Advent seriously by taking more time for prayer, offering small sacrifices for peace in families and the world, and receiving the Sacrament of Penance.

The Season of Advent: The word Advent means "comings," and it has a threefold character:

1. A season that directs the mind and heart to await Christ's Second Coming at the end of time.

2. A season to prepare us for Christmas—Christ's first coming to us 3. A season in which we seek a deeper awareness of Jesus' coming to us, present in each moment of every day—as indeed, He is Emmanuel, "God with us"; He comes to us most especially in the Holy Eucharist.

The readings from the Sacred Scriptures during the four Sundays of Advent assist us in focusing our attention on these "comings." The First Sunday of Advent emphasizes Christ's Second Coming (which is also the ongoing theme for weekday Masses until Dec. 16). The Gospel for the first Sunday of Advent is Mark 13:33-37, and we see the theme of the Second Coming in Jesus' words: "Be constantly on the watch! Stay awake! You do not know when the appointed time will come." His words call us to be watchful in prayer, ready for the Lord to come again. This is not meant to be about fear or worry, but we are to "wait in joyful hope."

For this time of waiting, the Advent Wreath draws a family together around the lighting of one of the four candles, each representing a week of this season. It is a special time to pray a Rosary, or a decade of the Rosary, and focus on the Joyful Mysteries that call to mind the events of Christ's birth.



From the Pastor's Pen

"Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths."

Each year on the Second Sunday of Advent our Gospel reading presents us with the familiar figure of John the Baptist. In today's Gospel, we hear the words from the first reading quoted. We see the ultimate fulfillment of those words in John the Baptist and the person of Jesus Christ. God's full presence has come to dwell with His people through the Incarnation. John the Baptist we see him announcing the coming of the Messiah and helping people prepare their hearts to meet Him by "proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins," John was preparing the people to encounter the living God as He would walk among them and minister to them through His preaching and healing.

As we enter the second week of the season of Advent, we are going to be caught up in preparations for Christmas and all the celebrations surrounding that holy day. Since this year's Advent is the shortest in many years (only three weeks instead of the usual four), it will make us feel very rushed and even totally unprepared as Christmas suddenly comes upon us. This is true not only about all the external preparations (decorations, shopping, sending greetings, gift buying and wrapping, etc.) but also about our spiritual preparations. So, ask ourselves how do I prepare myself?

Just like in the Gospel, the first step is repentance of our sins so we can receive God's forgiveness. John recommended a baptism of repentance in the river Jordan. A sign of conversion. Take the opportunity this Advent to heed the call of today's readings to repentance by visiting the Sacrament of Reconciliation. God is waiting there to offer you, His foraiveness.

Christmas Flowers: Anyone wishing to donate towards our Christmas flowers can do so by placing the donation in a marked envelope in the offertory.

Christmas Songs: Perhaps some people wonder why Christmas songs are not sung during Advent. In the Catechism of the Catholic Church #524, it explains that when the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, it makes present the long wait for the Messiah's first coming. We share in it, and we join in the preparation for Christ's second coming. The Advent songs we sing are meant to be songs of expectancy. There are typically 3 weekends to sing the beautiful carols: Christmas, New Year's and Epiphany.

Support a lifetime of service: Women and men religious have spent their lives serving others in prayer, ministry, education and care for those in need—usually for little or no pay. Today, their religious communities do not have enough retirement savings. As they age, they require essential care and medications. Please support them by giving to the Retirement Fund for Religious. Bishops Annual Appeal: Our goal this year is \$11,760. Keep in mind that any money collected above this goal comes back to the parish for our own use.

Advent Confessions: There will be 2 priests available here at St. Peter's on Wednesday, December 20th starting at 6:00 PM. They will also be at St. Joseph's the previous Wednesday, December 13th. There is also an opportunity on Monday December 18^{th} all day at the Cathedral from 9 AM – 6 PM.

Anointing of the Sick: Fr. Biju will be available to perform this Sacrament on the first Friday of the month after daily mass. Please contact him directly if you or a family member would like to receive. This is available January 5th.

First Sunday Rosary: We pray the rosary on the first Sunday of each month in church at 7:30 PM. The next one will be January **7th.** Please plan to attend to pray as our Holy Mother has called us to do.

***NOTE*:** When sending money for flowers, mass intentions, church support or special collections PLEASE make out separate checks or cash as these things go into different accounts and it is easier for bookkeeping purposes.
