Wise men came to worship Jesus

Wise men from far away saw an incredibly bright star moving across the sky. They followed the star to see where it would take them. It led them to the Infant Jesus. The wise men gave precious gifts to the Savior, gifts for a king: gold, frankincense and myrrh. They knew that Jesus was a great king, even though He looked like a small Child. Jesus gives us the greatest Gift – the Gift of Himself in the Eucharist again and again in a life-giving encounter. 

From the Pastor's Pen

The Epiphany: A gift for all of us

On Monday we celebrate Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. It marks the end of the Catholic Church's Christmas Season. The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is a "second epiphany" revealing His divinity and mission of Jesus after The Solemnity of the Epiphany. The Solemnity of the Epiphany is associated with the "visit of the Magi" – "Three Wise Men," sometimes called the "Three Kings" – whom tradition holds followed a star to Bethlehem to worship the newborn Messiah with gifts of "gold, frankincense and myrrh." The Gospel of Matthew 2: 1-12, however, is the only Gospel to mention the "wise men." It does not give their number, does not identify them as "kings," and does not say "when" they visited.

But this "visit" has a significant purpose. It fulfills the promise that a savior is born in Bethlehem. He is the long-awaited Divine Messiah, foretold by the Old Testament prophets, revealed as the Son of God, and recognized as such by those who witnessed His presence on earth as the source of human salvation by God. The Good News of the feast of the Epiphany of the Lord is that Christ comes to save us all, even the Gentiles too.

We read in the gospel the Magi presented their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh to Jesus. Gold, a symbol of royalty, represents His kingship; frankincense, used in worship, points to His divinity; and myrrh represents His humanity, particularly in His passion and death. The Magi brought gifts to Jesus. Yet, Jesus gave us the gift of His own very self. Epiphany reaffirms that God is truly with us. Let's offer Him ourselves as a gift with our weaknesses, our poverty of spirit, and our pains along with goodness and blessings that we have received. Happy New Year!
