From the Pastor's Pen

I am back from India. Had wonderful time with my family and I had a chance to visit the mission and meet some of our Fathers working in north east of India. Time to reconnect and visit. I thank Rick and Barb Mikshowsky for reaching me to the airport and taking me back. Thank you for your prayers.

As I landed I heard the disappointing news about the upcoming closure of Catholic hospitals, HSHS Sacred Heart in Eau Claire and St. Joseph's in Chippewa Falls after nearly 140 years of service to the community. Four years back I began my ministry there. It's impossible to recount the many lives touched and healed through these hospitals. Both spiritual and physical extension of Jesus' healing ministry.

In the gospel we encounter Jesus heals a leper. We read - A leper came to Jesus and kneeling down begged him and said, "If you wish, you can make me clean." Mark 1: 40-45. The man with leprosy took the initiative, approaching Jesus and asking for healing. In doing so, the leper violated the religious customs of the day by approaching a person who was clean. The confidence of the leper in Jesus' ability to heal him is evident in the words of his request. Jesus touched him, a sign of Jesus' compassion for the man. How do we deal with people who are ostracized by the society. Are we willing to reach out to them and bring comfort to them?

February 11th is World Day of the Sick, an observation started by St. John Paul II as a way for believers to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses. The Pope initiated the day in 1992 to encourage people to pray not only for those who suffer from illness but also for their caregivers. The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes.

Sunday, Feb. 11th is also World Marriage Day. This annual observance is to honor husband and wife as the foundation of the family, the basic unit of society. The very celebration of World Marriage Day is an opportunity to focus on building a culture of life and love that begins with supporting and promoting marriage and the family. As I congratulate all the married men and women on this special day, I thank them sincerely for their faithfulness and sacrifice in living out their married life.

LENT is upon us! This year Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day are both on February 14th! As we receive ashes on our forehead, let it be a visible symbol of our acknowledgement of our mortality and our dependence on a God who offers us His merciful love always. Let it be a time of renewal. I invite you to focus on at least one area of your life which needs some attention. I also invite all families to spend some time in prayer, if possible, in the church, or participate in Eucharistic Adoration, Stations of the Cross, and certainly participate in the Mass.

Lenten Regulations: The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 14. Lenten regulations are as follows: 1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.

2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Cabin Feverfest: St. Peter's annual Euchre party & Luncheon, is planned for March 3rd starting at noon. We will need more help from parishioners this year. Please find fliers in the back of church to take around to local establishments. There is also a sign up sheet for food and help.

Catholic Campaign for Human Development: Thank you for your contributions. In the US over 11% of the population lives in poverty. Through this collection, you support programs that address the root causes of poverty and provide a sustainable future for those struggling across the country. In addition, 25% of the funds we collect remain in our Diocese to fund local antipoverty projects. We will still take donations for this special collection this week.

Members of St. Peter's Parish: The ladies of the parish who met this last month are hoping to be able to provide a service to our church members and greater community. We are going to try to organize and be available to those who may need some help. We are going to begin with meals and/or visits to those who may be needing this type of assistance. We are hoping with enough of us involved that the needs of parish members can be spread out over the rest of us to provide assistance. Many hands make light work. This will allow us to be the hands of Christ in a more active manner and extend beyond our own families. I know all of us are busy. But I am hopeful that by making a group of us available and willing to help, the responsibilities for caring for others will be shared by all.
