"the ANSWER" Eucharistic Rally | June 7th at the La Crosse Center:

"The Answer" Eucharistic Rally on Friday, June 7, 2024, is for catechetical leaders, catechists, interested adults, families, parents and their 7-12 grade students. Please encourage the people of the parish to join us for a Eucharistic Procession with Bishop Barron and Bishop Callahan, excellent speakers, music, vendors, and, of course, Mass, adoration and confession.

For the first time in 83 years, our nation will celebrate a National Eucharistic Congress in July 2024. National Eucharistic pilgrims will travel along four routes that originate in California, Texas, Connecticut and Minnesota. After traveling across the Golden Gate Bridge, through Manhattan and across our country, all four routes will converge on Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Indiana, for the National Eucharistic Congress. Over 25,000 people have already registered for the event.

The Marian Route originates in Lake Itasca, Minnesota, and will travel through the Diocese of La Crosse. On June 7, 2024, Bishop Robert Barron, the National Eucharistic Pilgrims and the pilgrims from the Diocese of Winona-Rochester will meet Bishop William Patrick Callahan and our diocese on the Cameron Street Bridge in La Crosse, Wisconsin, to transfer the Blessed Sacrament to the Diocese of La Crosse.

The procession will then walk to the La Crosse Center for "the ANSWER"—a Eucharistic Rally that features nationally and internationally known speakers and musicians. National Catholic media, Catholics from across our 19 counties and many more people who simply want to encounter Christ will attend. Registration for "the ANSWER" opened December 15 2023.

Pilgrims will accompany Jesus through the Diocese of La Crosse with stops at La Crosse (La Crosse Center, Viterbo, The Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe), Sparta, Wisconsin Rapids, Ellis, Marshfield, Colby, Abbotsford and Wausau before traveling to the Diocese of Green Bay. The pilgrimage will touch all corners of our diocese and allow people from across Wisconsin to encounter Jesus Christ through adoration, Mass, prayer, fellowship, presentations on Eucharistic miracles and features on our Wisconsin natives on the path to sainthood.



From the Pastor's Pen

Fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare): Year B - John 3:14-21

This weekend we celebrate the fourth Sunday of Lent. The Fourth Sunday of Lent is called *Lætare* (Rejoice) Sunday. Since this Sunday occurs in the middle of Lent, as *Gaudete* Sunday is celebrated midway through Advent, *Lætare* Sunday reminds us of the event we look forward to at the end of the penitential season. As on *Gaudete* Sunday, rose-colored vestments may replace violet, with flowers on the altar. These outward signs symbolize the Church's joy in anticipation of the Resurrection, a joy which cannot be contained even in Lent.

The Gospel of John tells us about a night time call Jesus received from a prestigious Jew named Nicodemus. He was a wealthy Pharisee and member of the Sanhedrin. He meets Jesus by night and begins a long religious discussion. Jesus tells him "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." This is the first of three references in John's Gospel to Jesus being "lifted up" (cf. 8:28, 12:32-34).

Here John refers to an Old Testament story given in Numbers 21:4-9. On their journey through the wilderness, the people of Israel murmured and complained, regretting that they had ever left Egypt. To punish them, God sent a plague of deadly serpents. When the people repented and cried for mercy, God instructed Moses to make an image of a serpent in bronze and to hold it up in the midst of the camp so that those who looked upon the serpent might be healed through the power of God.

Jesus thus explains through it, God's plan of salvation by referring to the story of Moses and the bronze serpent. He reveals the Good News that God will show His love for mankind by subjecting His own Son to suffering and death as ransom for the sins of the world. The only reason for that is John 3:16 says "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." This is the summary of the Gospel message of salvation through Christ Jesus. God's motive is love and God's objective is salvation. Remember He died for us.

Have a blessed Lent.

Our guest speaker is Abby Johnson, author of Unplanned, which was made into a movie of the same name. Ms. Johnson was a Planned Parenthood Director for many years. After witnessing an abortion on ultrasound Abby changed her position on abortion. Horrified by what she witnessed she became an outspoken pro-life advocate against Planned Parenthood and abortion. Her testimony is powerful and her message must be heard; abortion is the killing of innocent life and not simply a women's reproductive health issue. The event will be from 9:30 AM – 4:00 PM.
