Message for the week of March 24: A Minute with Jesus: Jesus Wants to Live in Our Heart Always At the Last Supper, Jesus gave His Apostles – the first priests – the command to repeat His actions and words: to "do this in memory of Me." The presence of Christ, by the change of bread and wine in becoming His Body and Blood, takes place by the power of Jesus' Word and the Holy Spirit. The priest, in the role of Christ through his ordination, pronounces the words of Jesus, but their power and grace are God's. At Mass, as the priest speaks the words of Jesus, the bread and wine become His Body and Blood by the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus wants us to receive Him at Mass every Sunday because He wants to live in our hearts. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Thank you, Jesus, for Father Biju, who stands in for You, and thereby, we are able to receive You in Holy Communion at Mass. This week, read the passage of Jesus instituting the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper in Matthew 26:26-28.





# From the Pastor's Pen

# "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the LORD!"

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week. Through participation in the whole sequence of services, we share in Christ's own journey, from the triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday to the empty tomb on Easter morning. The procession with palms and accompanied by the Passion narrative we enter into this holy season. It is followed by the Paschal Triduum -Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil - three days that are the highlight of the Church year. Holy Thursday or Maundy Thursday (from *mandatum*, 'commandment' John 13:34) contains a rich complex of themes: we remember institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood, as well as Jesus' commandment to love and serve Christ in one another. We also meditate on the washing of the Apostle's Feet by Jesus besides Christ's agony and prayer in Gethsemane with the arrest of Jesus. After keeping vigil ('Could you not watch with me one hour?') Thursday passes into Good Friday.

Good Friday is a day of penance and abstinence to be observed as an obligation in the whole Church. The Celebration of the Lord's Passion includes: A liturgy of the word, The adoration of the Cross and Communion service. Good Friday is the only day of the year on which the celebration of Mass is forbidden. The church remains stripped of all decoration. It continues bare and empty through the following day, which is a day without a liturgy. We remember him dving on a cross. We remember the cross, a sign of shame and punishment, becoming the symbol of sacrifice, healing, unconditional love, total giving, redemption and salvation.

Then within the deep silence there grows a sense of peace and completion, and then rising excitement as the Easter Vigil draws near. Holy Saturday, ends the Lenten season. At Easter, we rejoice in the empty tomb—Jesus' resurrection. On this most holy night we celebrate the service of light, Easter Proclamation, liturgy of the Word, renewal of our own baptismal promises and liturgy of the eucharist. Easter vigil is called the 'Mother of all vigils' says St Augustine.

As we begin our journey in holy week with Christ, I encourage everyone to attend as many services as possible this week. On Monday of holy week, we have all day confessions at the Cathedral. Also on Holy Tuesday we have the Chrism mass. Bishop will bless the oil of the sick and oil of catechumens and consecrate the oil of Chrism. Priests will renew their priestly promises. Let's enter into this week with devotion and love. Wishing a blessed Holy Week to everyone.

Special thanks to Tom Schaub, their teacher, for helping to prepare them for this sacrament. There will be no morning weekday mass on this date.

All Night Adoration: There is a sign-up sheet in the back of church for all night adoration which begins immediately after Holy Thursday's mass. Jesus asks each of us "Could you not watch one hour with me?" Perhaps even half an hour?
