Message for the week of April 14: A Minute with Jesus:

The Eucharist is the Risen Christ On Easter, two disciples were leaving Jerusalem without hope as they believed that the Savior was dead. Jesus joined them as they walked but the disciples did not recognize Him as He now had a glorified body. The disciples were unable to interpret the events of Jesus' passion and death because they did not understand the whole Story. Jesus explained the things concerning Himself from "all the Scriptures." When Jesus was at the table with the disciples at Emmaus, they recognized Him upon receiving the Eucharist. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Lord, make my heart burn with a desire to read Your Word in Sacred Scripture. This week, read how Jesus explained how He fulfilled the Old Testament in His passion, death and resurrection, and allowed the disciples to recognize Him in the breaking of the bread - the Eucharist - in Luke 24:13-35.

From the Pastor's Pen

Third Sunday of Easter

On the third Sunday of Easter, we continue to hear Gospel accounts of Jesus' appearances to his disciples following his Resurrection. Today's reading, taken from the Gospel of Luke, follows immediately after the report of Jesus' appearance to his disciples on the road to Emmaus. This is the event being recounted by the disciples in the opening verse of today's Gospel.

Jesus greets his disciples with the word, "Shalom," God's peace. This is a most appropriate greeting. As the disciples have witnessed the death of someone they loved, and they now fear for their own lives as well. They were in fear and confusion. Jesus comes to them and wishes Shalom. Peace is what they need more than anything else. Then he shares a meal with his disciples and uncovers for them the significance of what was written about him in the Scriptures. He also mentions "that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem".

Jesus reveals himself again and again because He wanted his disciples to be authentic witnesses to the reality of his life as their risen Lord with his glorified soul and body. By inviting them to look closely at him and touch him, Jesus removed any fear that they were seeing a ghost. He instilled confidence in them that He loved. By eating a piece of fish before their eyes, he convinced them that they were not dreaming or having a mere vision or hallucination. They believed him. They were empowered by him. We know how they boldly preached him after Pentecost and were not afraid of being killed. They all, except John, became martyrs for Christ. Have a good week.
